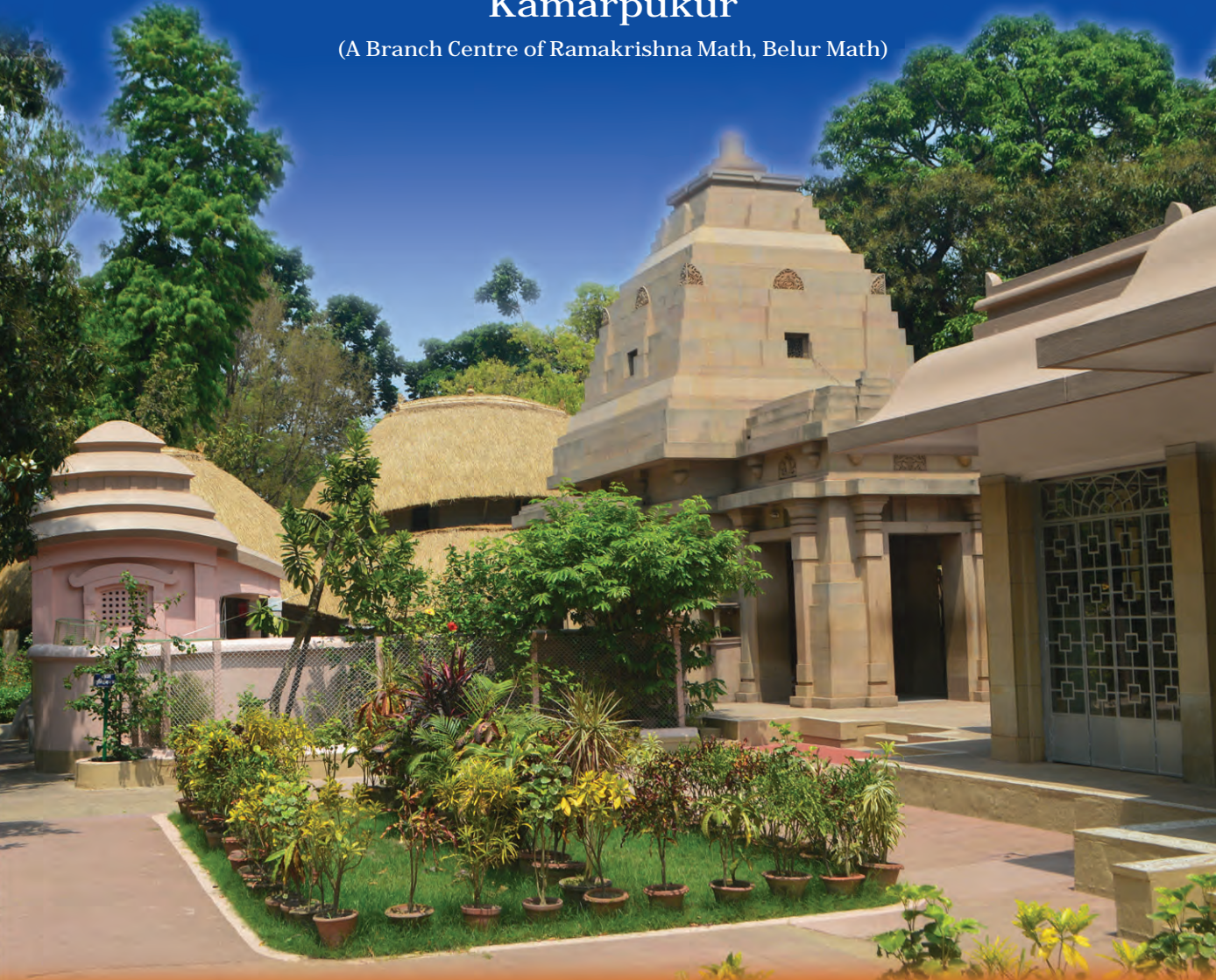

### Period of stay of Maa Sarada Devi at Kamarpukur



\*First Stay: May, 1859

At the age of five years, after marriage, the Holy Mother came to Kamarpukur for the first time. But in the next day she was taken back to Jayrambati by her uncle.

\*Second Stay: December, 1860

This year the Holy Mother stayed at Kamarpukur for a short period.

\*Third Stay: May, 1866 (?)

When Sri Ramakrishna was immersed in the depths of Sadhana at Dakshineswar, the Holy Mother at the age of thirteen years came to Kamarpukur and stayed for one month.

\*Fourth Stay: December, 1866 - January, 1867

This time the Holy Mother stayed at Kamarpukur for one and half month.

\*Fifth Stay: May - November, 1867

At the end of the Vedanta Sadhana, Sri Ramakrishna came to Kamarpukur from Dakshineswar with Hridayram and Bhairavi Brahmani. That time the Holy Mother at the age of fourteen years was brought to Kamarpukur from Jayrambati and stayed at Kamarpukur for about seven months.

\*Sixth Stay: 1885

The Holy Mother came to Kamarpukur on the occasion of the marriage of Ramlal.

\*Seventh Stay: September, 1887

After returning from Vrindaban, the Holy Mother spent nine months at Kamarpukur under extreme hardship condition. During this period, Gouri-Maa came to Kamarpukur and explained to the Holy Mother with the help of scriptures that her widowhood was not necessary as Sri Ramakrishna was her spiritual husband. One day the Holy Mother had a vision that the Ganga was gushing forth from the blessed feet of Sri Ramakrishna.



## Period of stay of Sri Ramakrishna at Kamarpukur

4. Fourth Stay: October, 1858 - December, 1860, (almost 2 years and 2 months)  
: 1265-1267, (Ashwin-Kartik-Agrahayan).
5. Fifth Stay: June - December, 1867 (almost 6 months) : 1274, (Jaistha-Agrahayan).
6. Sixth Stay: Middle of August-Middle of October, 1870 (almost 2 months)  
: 1277, (Shraban-Ashwin).
7. Seventh Stay: January - February, 1876 (almost 1 month) : 1282, (Poush-Magha).
8. Eighth Stay: Middle of June - End of September, 1876 (almost 3½ months)  
: 1283, (Ashar-Middle of Ashwin).
9. Ninth Stay: 1<sup>st</sup> July - Middle of September, 1877 (almost 2½ months) : 1284, (Middle of Ashar - End of Bhadra).
10. Tenth Stay: End of June - End of September, 1878 (almost 3 months)  
: 1285, (First of Ashar-First of Ashwin).
11. Eleventh & Last Stay/visit: 3<sup>rd</sup> March-10<sup>th</sup> October, 1880 (almost 7¼ months)

## Introduction:

Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna (1836 – 1886), the greatest religious prophet, was born at Kamarpukur, then an unknown village of Hooghly district in West Bengal at a very critical juncture in the nineteenth century when the spiritual values and disciplines of our ideal life were fast deteriorating due to the impact of materialistic pursuits. As a young man he came to Dakshineswar, near Kolkata, where he practised different religions for twelve years - at first Vedic religion with its various disciplines, then Islam and finally Christianity. He proclaimed that God exists and He can be realized. He affirmed that one must be sincere, earnest, regular and diligent in one's spiritual practices to achieve the ultimate goal of human life i.e. realization of God. His spiritual perceptions further enabled him to declare in line with the Vedanta, that there is Divinity in every human being which is one's real and immortal Self. By his own realization, he also brought out the ancient truth that all religions lead every being to the same goal.

Swami Vivekananda spread the message of his Master, Sri Ramakrishna to the West. He taught that human beings are basically Divine and not sinners. The impact of the teachings of Sri Ramakrishna can be clearly observed and people all over the world have realized the concept of service to humanity as worship to God and the spread of good will to all, irrespective of caste, colour, creed and religion will ultimately bring an end to all evils. A new civilization based on harmony, good will, peace and service to humanity is steadily ushering in.



## Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission

The Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission was established in the year 1997 and the headquarters is located at Belur Math, Howrah- 711 202, West Bengal, India. So far, 179 centres are spread over different parts of the world to propagate the following:

- Ideal** : Freedom of the self and service to mankind.  
**Aim** : Practice and preaching of the Sanatan Dharma, the eternal religion as embodied in the life and teachings of Sri Ramakrishna.  
**Motto** : Renunciation and service and Harmony of Religion.  
**Method** : Work and worship.  
**Activities** : Worship, training of monastic aspirants; religious preaching; general and technical education with an ethical and spiritual background, medical service, famine and distress relief work, rural upliftment and work among the toiling and emerging people of all classes and also the cultural activities.



The centre at Kamarpukur was affiliated to Headquarters of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math in 1947. Some of the significant holy places at Kamarpukur are :

**Birth Place:** According to English calendar, on Thursday, the 18th February, 1836, (As per the Indian Almanac, Wednesday, Phalguni Shukla Dwitiya, the second day of the light half of Phalgun) Gadadhar was born 12 minutes before sunrise. Just on the spot of his birth, the altar of the present temple of Sri Ramakrishna has been constructed and the things connected with his birth, viz. a husking pedal, a fireplace and a lamp, have been engraved on it. The marble image of Sri Ramakrishna installed on the 11th May, 1951, is since being worshipped there.

**Sri Ramakrishna's Living-room:** While at Kamarpukur, Sri Ramakrishna used to stay in the south-facing hut situated to the western side of the premises which is presently being used as part of the shrine of Sri Ramakrishna. Once he told the Holy Mother, "After my passing away, you stay at Kamarpukur, grow greens, live upon this simple fare and spend your days in repeating the name of the Lord. Whatever arrangements the devotees might lovingly make for you, don't let your own house at Kamarpukur be ruined". That was why the Holy Mother lived in that hut after passing away of the Master, despite dire financial and other difficulties.

**Sri Raghuvira Temple:** This was previously a small hut facing east. It had floor and walls of mud and a roof of straw. The present temple has been constructed exactly on the same spot with the same dimensions. In it, the Shalagrama Sheela of Raghuvira (Rama), the earthen jar representing Goddess Sitala, the Rameswara Shivalinga, an image of Gopala and the Shalagrama Sheela of Narayana are worshipped every day. The last two deities were worshipped by Lakshmi Didi, niece of Sri Ramakrishna.

**The Parlour and the Mango Tree:** In the parlour, Sri Ramakrishna used to meet people and instruct them. The Mango Tree planted by Sri Ramakrishna stands to the east of the parlour and still yields fruit.

**Yugi's Shiva Temple:** This temple is situated to the north of the residence of Sri Ramakrishna. In front of the temple his mother had a divine vision. While speaking to Dhani, she suddenly saw a beam of celestial light which emerged from the image of Shiva filled the temple and entered her body swiftly. Taken by surprise and overpowered with fear, she fell into a swoon. When she regained consciousness, she felt that the light was still in her womb and that she had conceived. The result was that Sri Ramakrishna was born.



The primary school of the Lahas: The school was held in the spacious Natmandir in front of Sri Durga Temple of Lahas where Gadadhar used to take school lessons at his early age.



In a short time he learnt to read and write, but soon his interest changed and he developed a tendency to get merged in ecstatic moods at the sight of beautiful scenery or in contemplation of particular deities. The boy liked the recital of the Puranas and the performance of village dramas more than his school lessons. His handwriting was good. The plays of Subahu and Yogadya which Gadadhar copied are still preserved in the Belur Math.

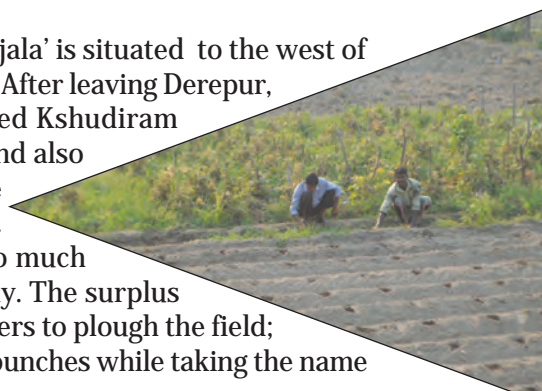
Halder-pukur: The vast water tank at the northern side of the Yugi's Shiva Temple is known as Halder-pukur. Many sweet memories of the boyhood days of Sri Ramakrishna centre round this tank. On innumerable occasions, Gadadhar came here with his friends and swam sportively there. The water of the tank has become sacred as Sri Ramakrishna, his father Kshudiram and the Holy Mother used to bathe in it.



Lakshmijala: 'Lakshmijala' is situated to the west of Halderpukur. It is a paddy field. After leaving Derepur, Sukhlal Goswami of Kamarpukur gifted Kshudiram

Chattopadhyay a few huts of his homestead and also a small plot of paddy field measuring about half an acre which Kshudiram gratefully accepted and lived there happily.

By the grace of Raghuvir, the land was soon producing so much rice that it became more than sufficient for the little family. The surplus was given to guests and visitors. Kshudiram hired the farmers to plough the field; when the seedlings were ready, he would transplant a few bunches while taking the name of Raghuvir and then talking to farmers to finish the job.



Temple of Gopeswar Shiva: This ancient temple is situated to the east of Sri Ramakrishna's house. Either Sukhlal Goswami, who helped Kshudiram to settle at Kamarpukur, or his forefather Gopilal Goswami had founded this temple with a big Shivalinga. When Sri Ramakrishna was passing through ecstatic moods at Dakshineswar, his mother hearing the report that Gadadhar had turned mad, got alarmed and went to Gopeswar Temple, where she practised hard penances to get the divine grace for the cure of her son's madness. Then she heard a voice directing her to do likewise before the Shiva of Mukundapur. As a result of her penances, she was assured that her son was not mad at all.



Budhui Moral Cremation Ground: To the east of the village of Kamarpukur, lies the cremation ground. While staying at Kamarpukur, Sri Ramakrishna used to go now and then to spend much of his time in contemplation.



**Sitanath Pyne's House:** Sitanath Pyne was a man of mediocre means. His house was to the south of the Lahas. Gadadhar used to go there in his boyhood days. When he was about 12 or 13 years old, he used to have ecstatic trances while singing devotional songs, or reading holy books like the Ramayana and the Mahabharata there. The women of the village then worshipped him as the embodiment of Sri Chaitanya or Sri Krishna. Once on the occasion of the Shivaratri, there was an arrangement for the performance of a village drama. As the boy was to act as Shiva fell suddenly ill, Gadadhar was persuaded to play that role. But as soon as he came to the stage decked with matted locks, Rudraksha beads and ashes, he fell into a deep trance which lasted very long and the performance had to be stopped.

Durgadas Pyne, a neighbour of Sitanath Pyne, was in favour of the system of keeping women always indoors. Even Gadadhar, who was held in great respect by him, was not allowed to enter his house. Gadadhar was extremely opposed to this system as he believed that the morality and integrity of womanhood could be preserved only by good education

and religious training and not by this rigorous system of confinement of women to the precincts of one's household.

With a view to teaching Durgadas a lesson, Gadadhar dressed like a weaver woman, sought shelter for the night in his house. Durgadas felt her helpless condition and permitted her to stay in his house for the night with other women. Gadadhar went inside the house and soon picked up all particulars about the family during conversation with the inmates. Durgadas finally understood the tricks played on him by Gadadhar, at first he felt much discomfort but afterwards began to laugh. Since then Gadadhar had free access to his house.

**Dhani Kamarini's Birth Place and Temple:** It is situated to the south-east of the Sri Ramakrishna's house. Recently, a small temple has been built on that site by some devotees and also an oil painting of Dhani with the child Gadadhar in her lap has been placed. In that temple the photo of Sri Ramakrishna is worshipped. Once Boy Gadadhar promised Dhani that at the

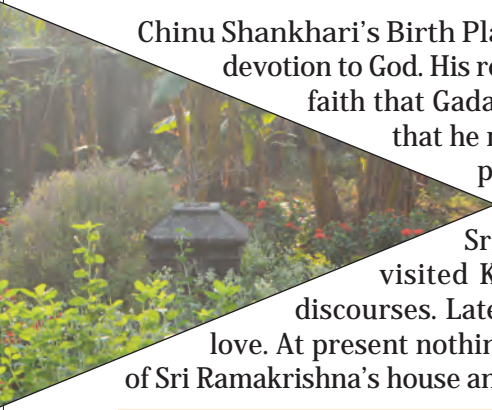


time of his investiture with the sacred thread he would accept alms from her. But it was contrary to that custom to accept alms from a non-brahmin on such an occasion. So his elder brother objected to it; but Gadadhar was adamant to keep his word to Dhani. And so he kept his word.





**Chinu Shankhari's Birth Place:** Srinivas (alias), though not born in a high family, had great devotion to God. His relations with the boy Gadadhar was very sweet. He had a strong faith that Gadadhar was a divine being and loved him dearly. He was afraid that he might die before he could witness the unfoldment of his divine play. One day he fed Gadadhar with sweets and prayed for his grace. Even when Sri Ramakrishna grew up, he kept loving Srinivas. After his sadhana periods, whenever Sri Ramakrishna visited Kamarpukur, Srinivas spent his time with him in religious discourses. Later the master often referred to his deep seated devotion and love. At present nothing exists at the site of Chinu's house situated to the north-east of Sri Ramakrishna's house and is still being maintained by Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur.



**Cremation Ground and Banyan Tree at Bhutir Khal:** This cremation ground is situated at the north-west of Sri Ramakrishna's house. When Sri Ramakrishna came home after his strenuous austerities at Dakshineswar at the age of 22, he used to go there and to the other cremation ground (Budhui Moral) for spiritual practices. There is an old Banyan tree under which he used to meditate during the greater part of the night. He also planted a Bilwa tree there.



**Palace of Manik Raja:** Manik Chandra Bandyopadhyaya of Bhursubo Village was renowned in the area for his great benevolence and so he became known as "Manik Raja". To the west of Bhutir Khal he reared an extensive mango grove for the public. His garden became the playground of Gadadhar and his friends. With the passage of time it has become a paddy-field, with only a few mango trees standing here and there as a reminiscence of the past. There are many other incidents mentioned in *Sri Sri Ramakrishna Lila-Prasanga* about the intimacy of Gadadhar with Manik Raja.

**Mukundapur Shiva Temple:** It is situated to the south-west of Sri Ramakrishna's Birth Place. On being directed by Gopeswar Shiva, Gadadhar's mother went to this temple and lay there without food and drink, praying for the recovery of Gadadhar from his supposed madness.



She, however, felt comforted when she heard a divine voice saying "don't be afraid, your son is not mad; he has become like this because of divine intoxication". It is said that from that time onwards many people have got their prayers fulfilled by practising such penances before the deity.



Anur: The village called Anur is situated about 3 km away to the north of Kamarpukur. Goddess Visalaakshi of Anur is a very popular deity.

One day a few ladies of Kamarpukur and its neighbourhood were going in a group to offer worship to Visalaakshi when the eight-year old Gadadhar also accompanied them. He recited from memory beautiful verses and sang songs about the deities, while walking with them. But while singing the glory of Visalaakshi, his body became stiff. Tears flowed down his cheeks and his voice also choked. The ladies felt extremely anxious. Prasanna, the devoted daughter of Dharmadas Laha, was also present in the party. All on a sudden it occurred to her mind that it might be due to the mystic influence of the Goddess on the simple child



who had great faith in her. When she spoke it out, all others believed it. They prayed to the Goddess repeatedly saying, “Oh Mother Visalaakshi be pleased; save us Mother; please look upon us with compassion.” Wonder of wonders! Immediately the face of Gadadhar brightened up with a sweet smile and gradually consciousness came back. The ladies felt relieved and with their hearts overflowing with devotion, they went to the temple, offered their worship duly and returned home.

Guest Houses: In quest of peace, a large number of devotees and tourists from all over the world are used to visit Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur throughout the year. Presently, there are two guest houses belonging to Sri Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur for the devotees who wish to spend a few days here on spiritual retreat. The devotees who want accommodation in the guest houses are required to contact the management of the Math over phone or through E-Mail first, for seeking prior permission and then the confirmation of the same is sent by post. The devotees should contact the Math office for accommodation during 4.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. For better accommodation one should prefer week days rather than holidays and festival days. For accommodation during holidays and important occasions/celebrations, the devotee must contact the Adhyaksha/President, Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur three months in advance. Two, three, four and five bedded rooms are available with or without attached bath rooms and also the dormitories for the group of devotees. It is a privilege to those who stay in the guest house to get the prasada at noon and night along with the tiffin in the morning.





## ACTIVITIES — A SYNOPSIS (2015-16)

**Math–Spiritual, Religious and Cultural Activities:** Besides daily worship, religious discourses inside and outside the Math, spiritual retreats and spiritual counselling by the senior monks, the Centre celebrates birthdays of the Holy Trio and other religious personalities. Sri Durga Puja, Sri Kali Puja, Sri Jagannath Mahaprabhu Rath Festival, Christmas Eve, Shivaratri and other occasions are also observed. On Ekadashi days Ramnam and on Purnima (full moon) days Shyamnam Sankirtan are held.



**Flood Relief Work:** Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur organized a Flood Relief Work w.e.f. 31.07.2015 to 09.08.2015 in 37 different villages of Khanakul-II, Haripal, Tarakeswar and Goghat-II Anchal/Taluk/Block under Hooghly District and the following food items were distributed among 21435 persons belonging to 4616 families.

**An Interim Report on 'Swachh Bharat Mission':** 'Swachh Bharat Mission' was founded by Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India and is being conducted by the



Headquarters, Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, Howrah. Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur, being a branch centre of the headquarters, has also implemented the Programme. This programme was initiated on 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2015 with grandeur and solemnity and followed on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2016, 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2016 and on 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. Our monastic brothers and workers from all Departments, Swami Vivekananda Janmo Sardho-shatoborsho Udjapan Samity, Kamarpukur, Gram Panchayet Pradhan and other members with 150 workers, BDO of Goghat-II, 14 numbers

of local Clubs, Block Health Medical Officer with his assistants, Panchayet Samity Sabhapati and many other villagers participated in cleaning work at Kamarpukur Locality with the help of banners, microphones, broom sticks, baskets, spades and bleaching powder etc. During operation, it was also repeatedly announced to keep the surrounding areas clean in future. All participants were provided with tiffin and Prasad at noon too. An enormous positive response from club members and localities was received and hope this programme will continue successfully.



**Value Based Education:** This year three separate programmes on "Value Based Education" were organized by Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur. The 1<sup>st</sup> 'Yuva Sammelan' conducted on 21<sup>st</sup> January, 2016 was dedicated to Sister Nivedita to commemorate her 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary. A number of 900 delegates participated in the said seminar. Swami Jnanalokanandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Vidyapith, Purulia and Swami Shivapradanandaji Maharaj, Adhyaksha, Ramakrishna Math, Barisha, delivered inspiring speeches while Swami Lokottaranandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur delivered the inaugural address.



The 2<sup>nd</sup> programme was a seminar on "Value Based Education" and was conducted by Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur at Ramakrishna Sarada Mahavidyapith (Kamarpukur college) on 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. About 300 delegates participated in the said seminar.

Another seminar (3<sup>rd</sup> programme) on "Importance of Ethics in Life" was organized at Vivekananda Sabhagriha, Kamarpukur Ramakrishna Mission Multipurpose School on 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2016. A number of 500 delegates including 20 monastic members participated in that seminar. Monastics and eminent scholars delivered speeches which were greatly admired by the delegates. In all the above three programmes Kits, Tiffin and Prasad were distributed among all the delegates. All monastic members, lay delegates and others actively participated in these programmes with great enthusiasm.





**Volunteers' S sammelan:** Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur organized a “Volunteers' S sammelan” on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2016 at Kamarpukur Mela Tala Math to commemorate the 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Sister Nivedita. The programme started with an opening song by Debmalya Das. Swami Swatantranandaji Maharaj was the President while Sri Subhendu Mazumder, professor, Jadavpur University was the Chief Guest of the programme. Swami Lokottaranandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur delivered the inaugural address. A number 500 delegates participated in the programme. Kits, Tiffin and Prasad were distributed among the volunteers.



**Bhakta S sammelan:** Ramakrishna Math, Kamarpukur organized a “Bhakta S sammelan” on 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2016 at Kamarpukur Mela Tala Math to commemorate the 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Sister Nivedita in a befitting manner.

The programme started with an opening song by Swami Kalyaneshanandaji Maharaj. Swami Swatantranandaji Maharaj and Swami Debaranandaji Maharaj attended and graced the occasion. Swami Lokottaranandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur delivered the opening speech. About 1200 delegates participated in the programme and were served with Kits, Tiffin and Prasad.



**Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa:** A project on “Gadadhar Abhyudaya Prakalpa” is successfully being continued for the children between the age of 5 years to 12 years with a mandate towards the development of physical, mental and intellectual status of the children. The project was initiated in 2010 to commemorate the 150<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda.

There are two units under this project. One at Kamarpukur and another located at Deregram village which is 4 Kms away from Kamarpukur. The Kamarpukur unit is having 100 (One hundred) Children while in Deregram unit, there are 50 (fifty) Children.

The children are provided with daily Nutritious food items along with milk. All educational materials together with uniforms and toilet articles are also supplied to them regularly.

To make the children healthy, medical check-up Camp is conducted twice in a month. Necessary treatment is also provided by the doctors. The total expenditure for running the project in these two units is borne by TCS Foundation, Mumbai.





### “VIVEK BITHI” (Ramakrishna Mission Primary School, Kamarpukur)

“Vivek Bithi”, a primary school was inaugurated on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2010 in commemoration of the 175<sup>th</sup> Birth Anniversary of Sri Ramakrishna Deva and began its regular classes on and from 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2010. The new building of the primary school was inaugurated in 2011 and the 1<sup>st</sup> floor was completed in 2014. The aims and objectives of this institution is to impart “Man-making and character-building” education to the students of Kamarpukur and its adjacent villages. This school also takes special care of the students belonging to socially deprived & economically backward groups. The total strength of the students is 235, where boys are 196 and girls are 39 in number of which 25 students belonging to schedule caste (SC), 4 students representing schedule tribe group (ST) and 22 students from other backward classes.

The total student strength of Junior Basic School is 127, where boys are 104 and girls are 23 in number.

Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur is maintaining a Government aided “Area Library” from 1<sup>st</sup> February, 1961 with 12,170 books, 2 daily newspapers, 8 periodicals and various competitive books. An average of 346 members are using this Library per month.

Audio-Visual Mobile Unit was operated to show films on the various subjects i.e. educational, cultural, health and hygiene in different villages of Goghat-I and Goghat-II Block in Hooghly District.





## KAMARPUKUR RAMAKRISHNA MISSION MULTIPURPOSE SCHOOL

Kamarpukur Ramakrishna Mission Multipurpose School, established in 1962, is a Secondary High School, recognized by the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education. The students of this institution have been obtaining good results over the years. The details of the performance of the Madhyamik Examination for the year 2015-16 are given below:

This school has been catering to the needs of the rural students, especially coming from the poor families of this area since 1962. As a result, this school has brought a huge number of students from the low income families, backward sections and minority communities under the fold of education since last five decades. At present the high school is running with almost 700 boys out of which 58 boys belong to schedule caste, 9 boys schedule tribe group and 97 boys to other backward classes. This school has also one hostel where almost 120 students could be accommodated. Other than day to day routine, hostel students also attend morning and evening prayers in the hostel shrine.

This school with four science laboratories (Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Geography) gives the real taste and concept of Science Education to the students. "On line Science Education" in collaboration with the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Belur Math, Howrah and a language Laboratory of Spoken English have opened a new horizon of knowledge before the rural students of this school. Keeping in view the modern system of education, a 'Smart Class Room (Multimedia room with interactive teaching equipment)' was inaugurated by most Revered Srimat Swami Vagishanandaji Maharaj, Vice-President, Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Belur, on the auspicious Saraswati Puja day i.e., 12<sup>th</sup> February, 2016 in the newly constructed eastern side of the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of school building. Also in the western side of the said building new Library Room has been constructed with modern facilities. Apart from the existing facilities of computer teaching programme, a gymnasium and grounds, a basket ball court are also built for the benefit of the students. Besides academic curriculum, students participate in co-curricular activities like inter-and intra-school sports meet, cultural competitions, seminar etc. Some of them also secured positions in zonal and district levels. They also perform band, parade and drill on the occasions of Netaji's Birthday, Republic Day and Independence Day etc. Like every year, this year also Saraswati Puja was performed with great enthusiasm and devotion. On that occasion monastic members, teachers, students etc. had their noon *prasad* at school premises.





The annual prize giving ceremony (2015-16) was arranged at 'Swami Vivekananda Sabhagriha' on 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2016. Swami Jayanandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Boys' Home, Rahara, was the president of the function. Attractive books and certificates of honour were distributed among the students. In the living memory of Swami Saradeswaranandaji Maharaj, a direct disciple of Holy Mother and the founder Secretary of the High

School, a Silver Medal was awarded for 'Best Amicable Leadership' to Sriman Tushar Tah an outgoing student of class X. While 'Swami Vivekananda Best Student Award' for the year 2015-16 which comprises a Silver Medal, Complete works of Swami Vivekananda and cash prize, was awarded to Sriman Antarup Mondal, also an outgoing student of class X.



The 55<sup>th</sup> Annual Sports Meet was held on 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2016 at the school ground and around 620 athletes took active part in the sports meet. Swami Sarvaganandaji Maharaj, Secretary, Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Narendrapur was the Chief-Guest of the programme. Other than athletics, students also performed Band, Yoga, Gymnastics and Drill etc. during the sports meet. Prizes and certificates were distributed among the successful participants.

This school is not only conceived as a mere academic institution but rather as a movement for imparting character-building education and helping students to inculcate the fundamental values of truth, purity and unselfishness in the students. This institution inspires the students to crystallize one of Swami Vivekananda's visions – "a glorious India of the future".

## AGRICULTURE

In view of various hazards in soil, water, creatures and environment due to mass and injudicious application of chemical fertilizers and pesticides in Agriculture, the Department of Agriculture, Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur has wholeheartedly attempted to overcome the said problems in its own farmland gathered experiences by adopting



Integrated Nutrient Management concept with the use of maximum quantity of organic resources and reduced quantity of chemical fertilizers on a large scale and Organic Farming concept with the use of maximum quantity of organic resources only on a small scale from the middle of the year 2011 in order to transmit those results to the farming community for their belief and satisfaction.

As such, the results along with photographs were shown and discussed the subjects in details by the expert scientists in a “Krishi Mela”, held every year in January or February and was initiated from 2012 for awareness and motivation to the farmers in view of a mass scale adoption of the latest technology / knowledge in agriculture. This year also “Krishi Mela” was held during 20th, 21st and 22nd January, 2016 in presence of eminent scientists and dignitaries.





So far as the result is concerned, it was observed that reducing the dose of chemical fertilizers slowly from 25% to 100% and replacing by organic resources reciprocally like, quality and nutrient enriched vermicompost, biofertilizers, green manures, green leaf manures, Azolla, Sanjibani and Panchagabya etc. and Botanical pesticides/Bio-pesticides/Neem oil/Cow urine/Vermiwash/Sanjibani/Nicotine-/chilli- extract etc. for controlling diseases and pests contributed similar or more crop yield in Paddy, various types of Vegetables and Flowers, Sesame, Ground Nut, Wheat, Pulses and Potato with significant reduction in the diseases and pests. But the potato yield in the variety “Jyoti” is still not at par by the application of limited dose of only organic resources, because the demand of nutrition in potato is too high. But in INM package, the potato yield is either similar or more in comparison with traditional package. Besides, long duration of crops, significant reduction in diseases and pests, shape, size, colour and tastes of the produce were also found significantly improved and achieved by the application of organic resources.

To produce the various components of Integrated Nutrient Management/Organic Farming packages for application in agriculture, 2 types of Earthworm, 5 types of Bio-fertilizer, 2 types of green leaf manure, 6 types of Green manure, Azolla, few identified medicinal plants and 7 types of Bio-pesticides are being scientifically maintained and produced along with Sanjibani, Sasyagabya, Kunapajala and Panchagabya as nutritive materials as well as controlling agent for diseases and pests along with Botanical pesticides/Vermiwash/ cow urine/Nicotine-/Chilli-extract etc.

During the year 2015-16, 34105 kg quality Vermicompost, 2388 kg Azolla and 120 kg quality Arbuscular Mycorrhizal Fungi Bio-fertilizer in sterilized soil condition were produced and used in R.K. Mission’s agricultural land. Quality vermicompost along with little quantity of Biofertilizers, Biopesticides and Azolla were supplied to a reputed local farmer for use and multiplication. Besides the use of vermicompost in different agricultural crops and vegetables as well as flowers, a good quantity of quality vermicompost was also supplied to other Depts. of Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur viz. High School, Yatri Nivas, Medicinal and other Gardens, Pallimangal, Mango and Coconut Plantation, Green manure plantation and maize plantation for AMF biofertilizer production.



## HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

The Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur, the holy birth place of Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna Paramhansa, has been considered one of the most important branch centres of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, District - Howrah.

It is learnt that once Bhagawan Sri Ramakrishna told 'Naren' (Swami Vivekananda) that, "you can see Him (God) when you close your eyes, can't you see Him when you open your eyes?" And He preached him to serve the poor, the downtrodden as God. Swami Vivekananda, while travelling

extensively from Kashmir to Kanyakumari, observed that mass population were living in painful and miserable conditions socially and economically. He himself felt the tremendous pain for the poor, the downtrodden and the destitute. His heart was outbursting until he could do something for them. He inspired the world with his historic message to serve God in the poor, the suffering, the ignorant and the sinner. Swami Vivekananda pronounced, "Who serves Jiva; serves God indeed."

Ramakrishna Mission has been doing many general and social welfare services including health, education, relief etc. since its inception. However, after the devastating flood in 1978 many of the villages were destroyed causing loss of home, property, crops, cattle etc. For this reason people were facing a lot of problems to maintain their daily life. The then President of Ramakrishna Math & Ramakrishna Mission, big hearted Srimat Swami Vireswaranandaji Maharaj who was enlightened with the vision of Swami Vivekananda, took initiative to rebuild villages through a new rural development project called 'Pallimangal'. Thus, the "Pallimangal" project started functioning in the year 1980 initially with some welfare programmes for the villages in Arambagh Division of Hooghly District.

'Pallimangal' is a Bengali word, meaning rural welfare. Obviously Ramakrishna Mission Pallimangal, Kamarpukur, Hooghly has been working in villages since its inception for the upliftment of the poor and downtrodden with an emphasis on the women folk through its health, education, economic, social and cultural development programmes under the direct supervision of its headquarters at Belur Math, Howrah.

### Mobile Medical Service:

Regular Mobile Medical Service is being continued since 1980 in and around the different villages of three Gram Panchayet (GPs) of two districts 'at free of cost'. The mobile medical team is composed of a general physician, a pharmacist, an assistant, local volunteers and a driver with a Medical Van.

At present, three centres are being continued to visit once a week at Kamarpukur & Balidewanganj in the district of Hooghly and Koalpara in the district of Bankura.

## National Programme for Control of Blindness:

This is a thirty four year continuous programme started in 1982 at free of cost. A well equipped eye day care centre was established through which the poor downtrodden village people of the adjacent areas of four districts e.g. Hooghly, Bankura, Burdwan and West Midnapur are being served on a regular basis since May, 2005. A good number of eminent ophthalmic surgeons, ophthalmic assistants, physicians, O.T. Sisters, Staff, devotees and volunteers are involved and always co-operating in this programme. Screening for operation IOL, Scanning of eye, Biometry for power testing of IOL, operation itself, refraction, medical treatment, spectacle distribution, health education and referral service, investigation facilities are being provided at Ramakrishna Mission Charitable Dispensary & Eye Day Care Centre, Kamarpukur.

### National Leprosy Elimination Programme:

Leprosy was one of the burning public Health Problems in and around the Arambagh Sub-division in West Bengal. A few years back, it was a disputed uncovered area for a long time. This programme was started in July, 2001 under direct supervision and guidance of State & Dist. Leprosy Society, in collaboration with German Leprosy Relief Association, in the allotted areas of Goghat-I & -II Blocks, Arambagh Block and Arambagh Municipality. The programme was envisaged with general survey, early case detection, diagnosis and MDT treatment, retrieval of the defaulter, Interpersonal IEC and Group IEC. Now the scenario of the programme has been changed since 2005.

The role of NGO has since been changed. Passive case detection and referral service to the PHC for diagnosis and treatment, Interpersonal IEC, Group IEC, Contact survey, DPMR management and SER activity etc. are being taken up by Ramakrishna Mission in the above mentioned areas of Arambagh Sub-division. Total population is about 4.5 lacs in the project area. The specific geographical areas have been entrusted to Six Field Workers (PMW), One Supervisor (NMS) and One Doctor.

### Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme:

This programme has been started since 2002 in collaboration with CARE India under Scheme-II. Now the service is continuing under Scheme-IV of RNTCP programme with direct supervision of District and State Govt. Health Department. It is a designated Microscopy and Treatment Centre [DMCTC] under Arambagh TU since 2007. Now this programme is carried out under DMCTC Scheme. During the year, Sputum examination for early detection for suspected cases and the confirmed patients were treated through our treatment centre & referred to the different sub-centres under Arambagh T.U.

Our activities of this programme like, DOTS treatment service, follow up the cases, defaulter retrieval, health education to the affected person and his/her family members, Interpersonal IEC, sensitisation of the common people etc. are being continued.

## Capacity Building for Sustainable Livelihood

Ramakrishna Mission Pallimangal is the wing of integrated rural developmental work of Ramakrishna Mission, Kamarpukur, Hooghly, West Bengal. This has successfully been running with several rural developmental programme including self-reliance vocational training and production as well as marketing support system in weaving, handicrafts, incense sticks making and food processing having a primary objective of helping the poor and destitute **women** by providing them some opportunities of income generation and thereby improving their economic as well as social status.



A brief description of the programme implemented during the year 2015-16 is mentioned below:

**Soil Testing Laboratory:** Considering the needs and priorities of the most important cultivated areas of West Bengal, the soil testing laboratory was established at Kamarpukur in the year 1983. The objective was to encourage the farming community for scientific agriculture with balanced use of plant nutrients obtained from soil analysis study for higher production, economy in input cost, maintenance of soil health and reduction in environmental pollution etc.

The following figures depict the performance of this laboratory during the year 2015-16:

**Mushroom Spawn Production:** As a follow up activity, after completion of Swami Akhandananda Seva Prakalpa held during June, 2012 to March, 2014 particularly after the training imparted on "Modern method of Mushroom cultivation", an attempt was made to produce the Spawn of Mushroom at Kamarpukur Pallimangal to support the trainees for their income in low cost Mushroom production house as provided by said Prakalpa. So far, 326 packets of spawn (Rs. 15 per 200g in each packet) of Dhingri (*Oyster*) was prepared and sold to the Ex-trainees and other Indenters. Thus an individual trainee is earning about Rs.2000-Rs.3000 per crop (by 50-60 days) maintaining their other domestic works at home. Income may be increased if more mushroom is cultivated.



**Food Processing Unit:** This unit was launched during the year 2001 with an objective of promoting Cottage Industries with a locally available resources, minimizing wastage of perishable vegetables/fruits like, Tomato, Mango, Guava, Pineapple etc. and for attracting the farmers a new source of marketing as well as income. At present various items like Pickle, Jam, Jelly, Sauce, Squash, Kasundi, Papad, Snacks and Ghee are being produced in our unit which have got very good response and demand from the customers.

**Mini Jute Spinning Programme:** This unit has been manufacturing twine from raw jute regularly since its inception in the year 1987. The project was commenced in collaboration with erstwhile Jute Technological Research Laboratories (now NIRJAFT), Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India and that of Government of West Bengal. The idea was to bring the processing unit at the look of jute growers as well as to help the jute farmers and to provide employment to some rural youths.

**Weaving Project:** The weaving project has been functioning satisfactorily since 1983. Handloom weaving and stitching of products are being prepared here by women workers. Different types of cotton items are being produced regularly at this unit. They are namely handkerchief, duster, side bag, asan, gamchha etc.

**Non-formal Education:** Due to socio-economic difficulties, a considerable part of our rural population is yet to see the light of education. Pallimangal has been conducting a number of Non-formal Education centres at different villages to provide minimum literacy to them. Books, khata, teaching materials, school dress and bags are distributed to every student during this year. Presently 27 such NFE centres are being continued for the backward and down-trodden classes of children by Pallimangal in 22 villages under 14 Gram Panchayet areas and one in Tarakeswar Municipality through active involvement of village level organizations. 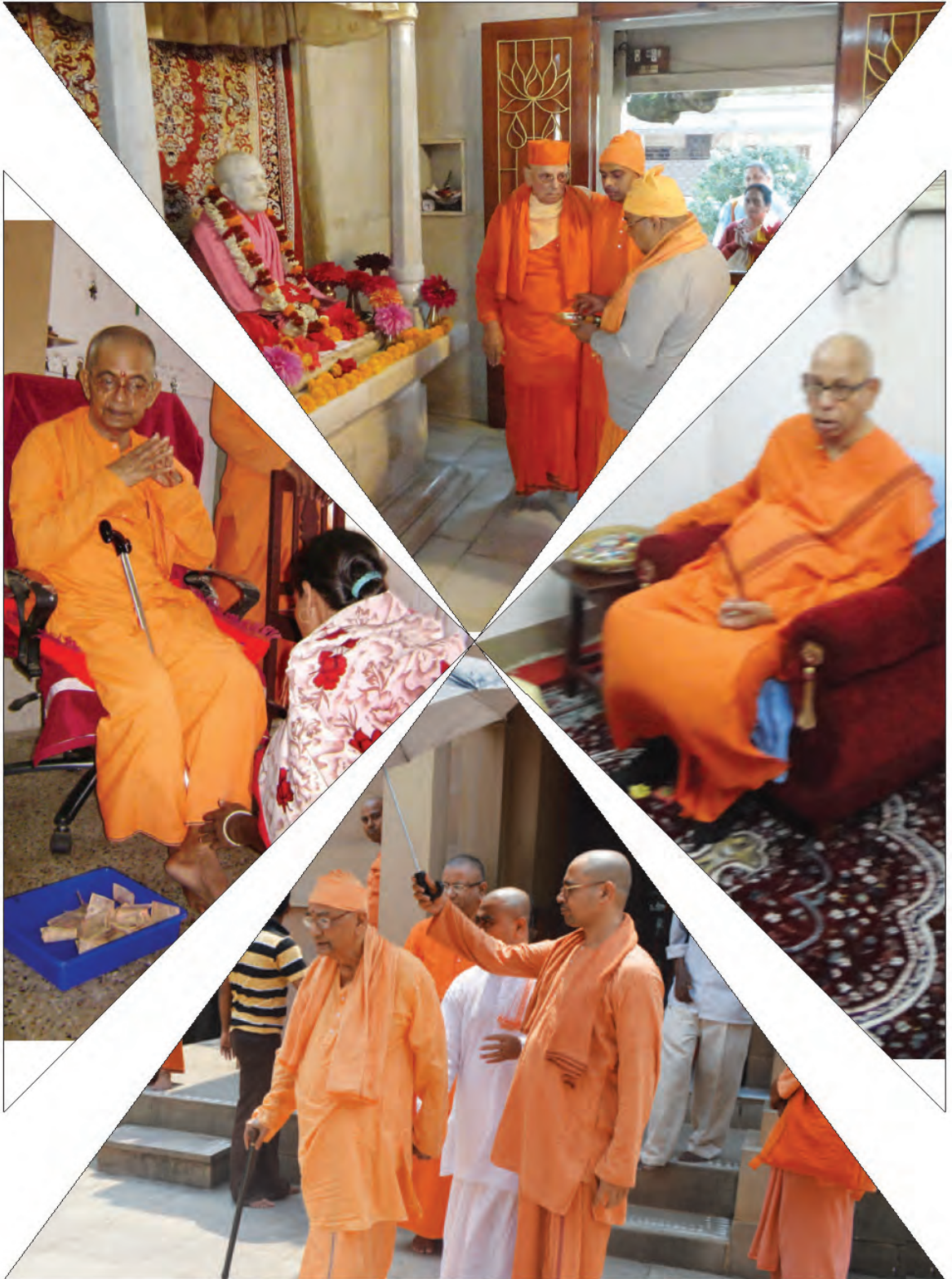

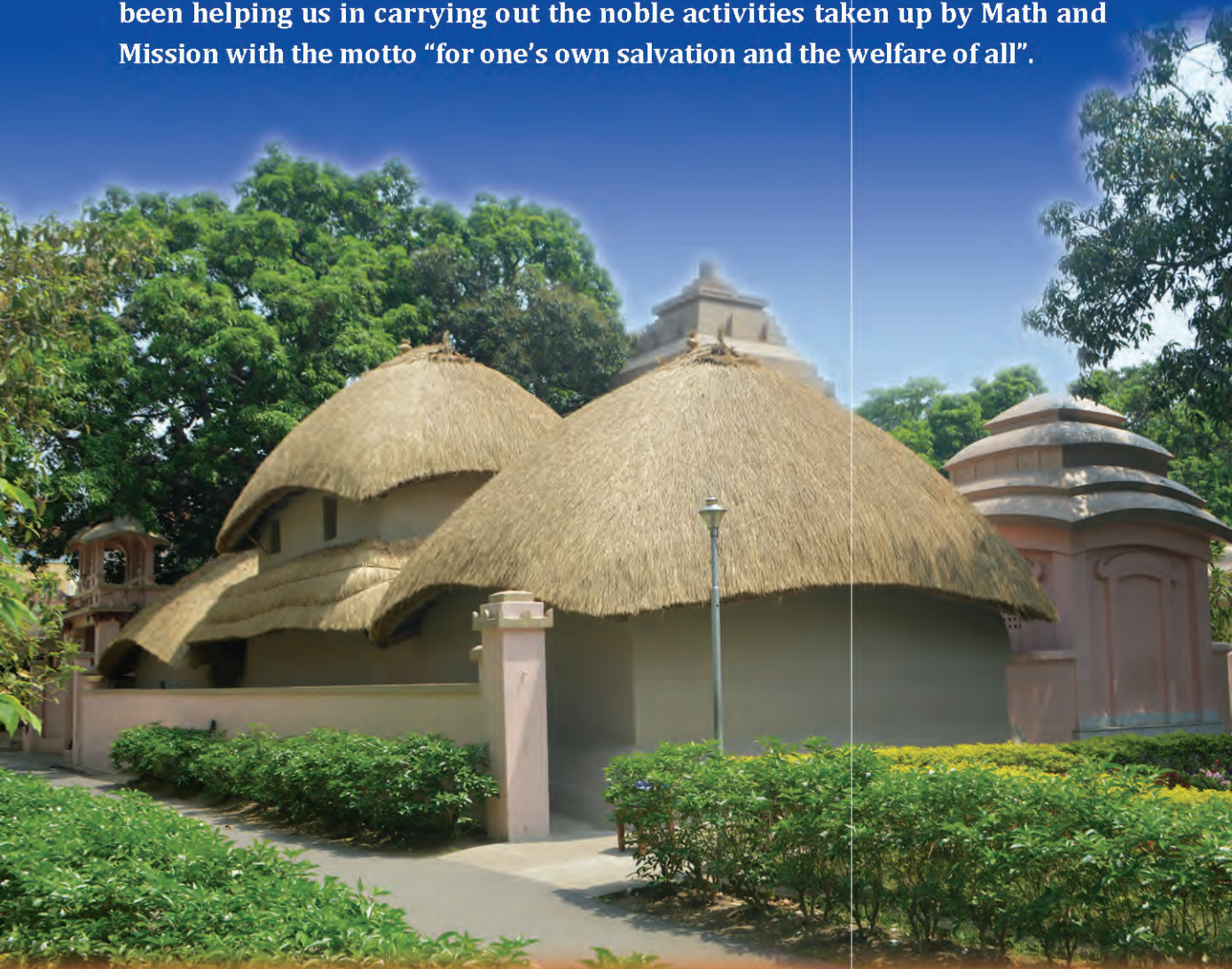
